The New Orleans Mission is about transforming lives. As an emergency shelter we provide food, clothing, shelter, and spiritual guidance to the regions homeless, hurting and hungry. Our strategy is to **RESCUE** people from physical and/or sexual abuse, mental illness, financial hardship; strengthening the **RECOVERY** efforts of the people seeking our support to overcome addiction; and fostering their successful RE-ENGAGEMENT into society as healthy, disciplined skilled men and women who are ready to lead a sustainable productive, purposedriven life.






RESCUE:

Homelessness is caused by a wide variety of factors and every person's situation is different, which means ending homelessness needs to be different for each person. Since Katrina, homelessness has evolved in New Orleans and is primarily caused by the following factors: lack of affordable housing, extreme poverty, excessive substance abuse, unlivable wages and unemployment. The New Orleans Mission has a 30 year history addressing the needs of the homeless. Today we are the largest service provider to the homeless population in the greater New Orleans Metro area, serving more than 2,300 unique men and women this year.

RECOVERY:

Nearly every homeless death can be attributed to years, sometimes decades, of untreated substance abuse and mental health issues. Federal mental health experts recognize the need for holistically designed recovery support services, like the Mission's year long discipleship program, that offers spiritual coaching, mentoring, family support, life skill training, and vocational training. Hundreds of men and women have graduated from the program, experienced God's life changing transformation, and overcome the control that addiction had on their life.

RE-ENGAGEMENT:

The re-engagement component of the Mission's foundational strategy is second to none offered in city shelters. Successful re-engagement into society is the result of the educational and life skills workshops and innovative vocational training programs that include paid on-the-job training with a monitored savings program and personalized case management. Assistance with job searches is also provided to our graduates as needed. Our vocational training programs continue to grow and maximize employment potential for those individuals in our discipleship program.

Training components include commercial and residential landscaping, commercial car washing, day labor workforce development, and recycling warehouse training that emphasize building strong work ethics and how to effectively hold a job.

Event training includes culinary training for daily meal services, plating food and serving beverages to guests, event preparation and set up as well as learning demonstrate outstanding customer service.



Redemption Nola provides a creative outlet for the women in our program to learn new skills by transforming old, donated cast-off jewelry into beautiful new creations, reflecting God's restorative power in their lives and hearts. They are learning new skills as well as taking steps in sharing their testimony with the world and realizing how powerful it can be. Their designs are sold in various stores and boutiques as well as hosted in home parties and they receive a portion of the proceeds for each piece sold.



We refocused our efforts on healing through an expanded discipleship rogram as individuals valk through the steps of Rescue, Recovery and Re-Engagement


THE TRANSITIONAL HOUSE BUILT





GOD'S VISION IGNITED

From humble beginnings in 1989, the Los Angeles Rescue Mission sent Micheal Greer as a missionary to New Orleans to purchase an old furniture warehouse and begin to feed men in a soup kitchen. His vision was from God, but it would take decades to be fulfilled. Continuing to trust the Lord he was faithful in his part of God's plan. He fed and sheltered men in the community and began to share the love of Christ with them. As the years passed, the mission slowly started to grow, adding our family center and then womens house. Even through the changes in leadership, God continued to work and use His people to touch the community. In 2012, David Bottner came to the Mission. With his humble heart and servant leadership as well as drive for excellence things began to change,

This will be a place where women can reunite with their children and learn to become the mothers God created them to be.




EARL SCIONEAUX DIRECTOR OF DIVINE STAFFING

He strives to instill in them the necessary biblical principles in all aspects of operations in the Mission's vocational program. When asked how he handled any challenges that arose in 2021 he confidently said that he is reminded to not allow the circumstances of this world to influence the principles of the divine. "God is in control", stated Earl. His anchor verse is Matthew 6:33, "But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." In his own personal development as well

as the aiding of development of the men, he uses a process divinely designed for success. He first seeks the Lord in creating a **vision**, following through with a **plan**. He then makes the appropriate arrangements in **preparing** following with the implementation of according actions. Her focus for the women is to not only teach them who God is, but who they are in and through Him. Throughout this unique year she was faced with a shortage of women committing to discipleship. When asked how she overcame that hurdle she passionately stated, "By focusing on the women that God has put in front of me and taking the time to train leaders up in the ministry." She is actively looking forward to watching the consistent growth and sanctification in the lives of the ladies, as well as her own. All the while encouraging a constant attitude of trusting in the Lord. A scripture Eileen holds close to her heart is Galatians 6:9 "And let us not grow weary in doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up."

RESTORATION

Restoring Families... Impacting Generations.

Ninety percent of homeless and runaway children are from fatherless homes. Approximately seventy five of teenage suicide occur in a home when one parent is absent. Children who grow up without the love from both parents are more likely to be in jail, do drugs, or end up homeless. At the New Orleans Mission, we are helping broken mothers and fathers to heal their lives, learn how to love and show up differently as a parent. Restoring the relationship they have with their children, giving them another chance to be the parents God created them to be.

Matt came to the mission in 2019. He was a father to a beautiful little girl, but he was not fulfilling that role in her life. He was putting drugs, alcohol and selfishness before his child. He grew up in a two parent home, but never felt that his dad was there for him. He didn't feel loved. He tried to deal with the pain by turning to drugs and alcohol. In 2019, Matt woke up in a hotel room, he had been robbed by the woman he was sleeping with. All he had left was his car and within 24 hours he had rolled it. He was at the end of himself when he came to the Mission where eventually he let go of everything. A full surrender of self and all material things, knowing God's plan is greater. He began to realize the gift his daughter was in his life. He sent letters to her every weekend



beginning the healing process in their relationship. He has since been reunited with her.

"I am grateful for the Mission and GHR, through my relationships here I have learned how to be loved and how to really love others well." says Matt.

It is this change that has made him a better father and will impact his life forever.



And after you have suffered a little while, the **God** of all grace, who has called you to His eternal glory in Christ, will himself restore, confirm, strengthen and establish you.





Becca grew up with her mom and stepdad. Being verbally and emotionally abused by her mom, she didn't understand how to love people especially in difficult situations. Becca became selfish and put everything else before her children. She left them with her aunt and uncle to raise and continued in her vices until she found herself at the Mission. Through her own relationship with Jesus and the peace she has been able to find during her time at Lynhaven she has fully restored her relationship with her daughter. Her son has been able to forgive her for not being the mother she should have been and to love her when she was extremely hard to love.

"I am beyond grateful for the opportunity to sit at God's feet, for the people God has placed in my life that let me borrow a little bit of their faith and lent me a little bit of their hope when I thought there was none and who gave me their love when I couldn't even love myself." Becca.

There are many stories like Becca and Matt; testimonies of God changing hearts, relationships being healed and mothers and fathers reuniting with their children to love them in a way they couldn't before. The New Orleans Mission is a platform God is using to impact lives for generations to come.

ALUMNI




Deonne arrived at the New Orleans Mission on July 4th, 2017. Weighing only 87 pounds, she had tried absolutely everything to overcome her addiction. After years of no results and no hope, she went to the Mission to die, so her 10 year old son wouldn't have to watch, but God had something better in store for her. Upon arriving at the Mission, she was surprised at the love that was shown to her. The staff loved her in spite of her not even loving herself. They introduced her to the Word of God and showed her how to apply it to her own life. She joined the discipleship program, where she continued on her journey of physical, mental, and spiritual restoration. With the help of her new found family, she was able forgive herself as well as those who had hurt her along the way. After graduating on February 23rd, 2018, she began working as a volunteer coordinator for the Mission, and is still in that position today. She has a completely restored relationship with her now 14 year old son, Christian and is currently focused on finding them a forever home.

Terry moved to New Orleans from Houston after Hurricane Katrina in 2007 to help clean up after the storm. He was homeless and remained that way, staying under the bridge, or wherever he could. He stayed at the Mission occasionally as a guest, until 2011 when he decided to join the discipleship program. Graduating in 2012, he resolved to stay at the Giving Hope Retreat serving on staff for the last 9 years as music and worship leader for our Sunday services. Since his time at the mission his life has changed drastically. The program gave him structure and a personal relationship with Christ, a new way of life with peace and joy. He has become a new creature through Christ and is looking forward to finding his true purpose while continuing to serve in the ministry and help build His kingdom. "I LOVE the Mission and my Mission family!"





Ryan came to the Mission in 2015. He was hopeless, obese, unemployed, suicidal, non-functioning alcoholic in serious physical, mental, and spiritual distress. He suffered from anxiety and depression and took a lot of medication to ease his pain. The Mission and the Giving Hope Retreat gave him hope through the gospel of Jesus Christ. Through this he was able to receive forgiveness, extend forgiveness and accept salvation. He learned who he was in Christ and how God sees him. He was equipped with the tools needed to live a life with eternal perspective. Ryan graduated in 2016. Today he is hopeful, nearly 100 pounds lighter, and has a great career at a fortune 500 company; he loves life and is a responsible, contributing member of society. God has restored all he has lost and more. He is excited for the future and looking forward to watching his children and grandchildren grow up, come into their own and live

Staci came to the Mission in November of 2018. She was in a very dark place and completely broken. The classes and counseling provided a better understanding of the bible and allowed her to heal and forgive herself and others. She graduated from the program in May of 2019 and is now happily married, living with her wonderful husband and her son Grayson. She is working in the dental field and is striving to be the best mother, wife, daughter, sister, and granddaughter she can be. She is excited about her life and looking forward to the future to make positive memories with her family and to see what doors God will open next.

Devin was born in New Orleans and grew up in Metairie attending Jesuit High School. He had many careers, always took care of his family and lived a life that looked successful. Through a series of losses he found himself at rock bottom. That is when he came to the New Orleans mission. He found it offered more than a room for the night, it offered hope. He graduated the discipleship program, went through the masters program and became full staff, eventually becoming the director of Media productions for the New Orleans Mission. Devin was self taught in all he did. His passion for media and photography drove him to become one of the best in his field. Humbly serving at the New Orleans Mission in his God-given talent, creating awardwinning videos and documentaries. Overcoming adversity and allowing God to use his struggles to touch the lives of others with his work.

Fred grew up in Livingston, Louisiana. He was married and had 2 girls. Being an alcoholic for 35 years, Fred lost his family and found himself without any place to go. He came to the Mission where he renewed his relationship with Jesus. He had accepted Christ when he was 8 years old and had always loved the Lord but was never living for Him. When he looked back He knew God had always been there with Him.
